Task Description

You will create a PowerPoint presentation about food and food culture in an English-speaking country. Your presentation should show knowledge about food, understanding of culture, and correct use of English.

Presentation Requirements

- **Length:** Approximately 7-8 slides
- **Language:** English

1. The presentation must include

- Traditional foods or drinks from the country
- Information about food culture, for example:
 - When people eat (mealtimes)
 - Special food traditions (holidays, celebrations)
 - Street food or everyday food
- Interesting facts about the food or culture
- How food is connected to daily life in the country
- Eating habits (e.g. eating together, eating out, takeaway culture)
- Table manners or customs
- Food connected to family, holidays, or traditions
- How food shows what is important in the culture (comfort food, fast food, celebrations)

2. Structure and Organisation

- Includes a title slide with title and name
- Clear headings on each slide
- Information is presented in a logical order
- Slides are easy to follow and well organized

3. Visual Design

- Relevant pictures are included
- Font size and colors are easy to read
- Slides are neat and not overcrowded

4. Oral Presentation

- Speaks clearly and audibly
- Uses English when presenting
- **Does not read everything directly from the slides**
- Shows confidence and eye contact
